Impact of Charitable Giving

- * \$11.8 M in cash gifts, added to \$11.8 M of volunteer hours, contributed goods, and services generated a \$23.6 M impact.
- * A total of 5,528 volunteers gave 97,101 hours.
- * Of every dollar given only 3¢ is spent on administration and 3¢ on fundraising.
- * Of every dollar given 94¢ goes into program services.

ABCCM Served 28,343 or 1 in 11 persons in Buncombe County in 2021

Crisis Ministry: Provides food, clothing, furniture and emergency financial assistance for utilities, rental assistance to keep families intact, in their homes and on the job.

Jail Ministry: Provided meaning and direction to inmates through Bible studies, religious materials and chaplaincy.

Homeless Ministries: Served 489 homeless, provided 452 homeless with transitional housing, and provided 166 overnight stays for 31 persons; plus the Code Purple van went out to distribute food and blankets to encampments.

Employment and Training Ministry: 299 total employed; and an average job placement rate of 56%

Doctors' Medical Clinic: Served about 30% of uninsured in Buncombe Co., and distributed \$2,952,300 in medicine.

Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry

ABCCM is a unique faith-based ministry addressing hunger, homelessness and access to health care for the under-served in Buncombe County and homeless Veteran services across NC. Begun as a small collaboration of churches in 1969, ABCCM is still church owned and volunteer driven by 300+ churches of all denominations and other faith groups. Volunteers offer listening with dignity, grace, mercy and lovingkindness through six ministries without discrimination. www.abccm.org

Crisis Ministry (4 locations) is a listening ministry of volunteers providing short-term and long-term strategies through counseling, food, clothing, furniture, household items and financial assistance for rent/mortgage, utilities, heat; along with furniture and household items in collaboration with the Donations Ministry. Call 828-259-5322 to arrange for a large furniture pick-up.

Jail Ministry is a listening ministry in the Buncombe County Detention Center where volunteers offer Bible studies and Chaplains connect to help detainees find meaning and purpose at the crossroad in their lives. Library cart volunteers organize religious materials. Ministry needs listed on the web page.

Medical Ministry offers the only free clinic led by volunteers so the uninsured have access to medical care and medicine. Most, working without insurance of any kind are served by two pharmacies that distributed about \$2.9 million in prescriptions and about \$3.1 million in medical care, for an impact of \$6 million in health care in Buncombe County. Dental services were suspended during the pandemic.

Transformation Village volunteers offer 100 transitional housing beds for women and moms with children, including Veterans. Emergency shelter is offered along with clinical treatment. Healing, Hope & jobs leads to 8 out of 10 successfully graduating with stable income and permanent housing.

Veterans Restoration Quarters volunteers offer a 250 bed campus for men with 160 transitional housing beds for Veterans; 40 beds for emergency shelter; plus 50 permanent supportive housing units. Emergency shelter is offered along with clinical treatment. Healing, Hope, and jobs leads to 8 out of 10 successfully graduating with stable income and permanent housing.

Veterans Services of the Carolinas serves through four programs: 1) Veterans Homeless Prevention/Rapid Rehousing serving 270+ families, 2) Veterans Employment and Training Services (VETS) placing 300+ Veterans into jobs, 3) Veterans Call Center averaging 1,000 crisis calls a month, and 4) HOPE (Healing Outreach Partnerships for Empowerment) reintegrating chronically homeless vets.

ABCCM has a great stewardship track record where 94¢ of every dollar donated goes into direct ministry to people in need, compared to the national average of 75%.
